Each company will be represented by one or several employees, including human resources specialists. Each company will be seated at a round table.

The students will be divided into 12 groups.

The Woodland Community College will be among themselves in 1, 2 or 3 groups.

Each group will spend 10 minutes with each company.

At each table, after the students sit down and everyone introduces themselves, the industry people will talk about the company's activities, products and services, the types of internships and jobs it offers, and the profile of people they hire.

They will also answer any question the students may ask.

There will be additional time for interaction between students and industry at 5:30, during the student research poster session and the networking session.

Students who are interested in establishing connections with industry at the event should bring along their resume with contact information, and 'business cards' if they have.
